APAS 'Gives Back' with Scholarship Endowment

Just a few months after members of YSU-APAS voted to establish a scholarship endowment as part of the union's "APAS Gives Back" initiative, the scholarship committee reports that fundraising has already reached 33.45 percent of the \$10,000 goal.

Eighteen APAS members have contributed so far, for a total of \$2,085. The gift average was \$123, and the highest individual contribution was \$525. The union added a \$1,000 matching gift, and a raffle at the spring membership meeting raised \$260 – expect to have more raffle opportunities at future meetings.

The scholarship was established as part of YSU-APAS's continuing effort to support the university and its students and to demonstrate the tremendous value that APAS members bring to YSU.

"Our union wanted to come together to show our support of YSU students in a very tangible way," said APAS president Michael Glonek. "We thought that the best way to demonstrate this support was through the establishment of a scholarship endowment. It very clearly demonstrates that APAS members are invested in this university and the success of our students."

"The APAS Scholarship Endowment at YSU" will be awarded annually to a YSU student who qualifies under scholarship criteria established by the committee. First priority will be given to a qualifying APAS dependent.



Jim Olive, a YSU alum, Vietnam War veteran and APAS member who helped launch the YSU Office of Veterans Affairs as the first coordinator of the office in May 2009, retired Dec. 31 after working 21 years at YSU.

Olive came to the university after serving in Vietnam and earned a bachelor's degree in education in 1973. He

moved to Miami, Fla., completing a master's degree in education at Nova Southeastern University, and then taught school there for 20 years. He returned to the Youngstown area in the early 1990s, working as an instructor in the YSU Reading and Study Skills Center and co-authoring and

implementing the Center for Student Progress. Later, he began and managed YSU's prison program at the Metro College for 10 years before accepting the position as coordinator of the Office of Veterans Affairs.

"Retirement has been wonderful," Olive said. "I finally got over the feeling I have to be somewhere on campus. Susan and I are traveling a lot between visiting our daughter in DC and our son in North Carolina who is flying F-15's for the Air Force."

Patrick Williams, a retired U.S. Army Major whose military career spans 25 years, has replaced Olive as YSU's new coordinator for Veterans Affairs.

For the second consecutive year, the YSU wellness program that APAS member Carrie Clyde coordinates was presented the **Healthy Ohioans-Healthy Worksite** Award for its commitment to the health and well being of its employees.
